

Level 2 Apprenticeship in Supporting Teaching and Learning in Schools



This apprenticeship is for people who work with children and young people within education settings. A nationally-recognised training programme combining real work with learning and training - both on and off the job.

Level 2 Apprenticeship in Supporting Teaching & Learning in School

The Level 2 Apprenticeship for Supporting Teaching and Learning in Schools is designed for learning support staff whose responsibilities at work are supervised. They will be working under the direction of the class teacher whose lesson planning and day-to-day direction set the framework within which the individual works. It also provides a great opportunity for learners to progress into a range of educational settings. Learners must be at least 16 years old and have an awareness of the purpose of supporting teaching and learning in schools

Job Titles	Job Roles
Teaching assistant	Contribute to preparing the classroom for learning activities; working with groups of, and individual pupils, who require extra support
Learning support assistant	Supporting and including students with learning difficulties/disabilities in education settings
Pastoral/welfare support assistant	Contributing to creating an environment of care and support that promotes learning and development

Progression

The apprenticeship pathway will prepare learners to progress, either to the Level 3 Apprenticeship or the Level 3 Diploma in Supporting Teaching and Learning in Schools as a stand-alone qualification. Progression to Level 3 Apprenticeships will also enable learners to move to higher levels of work or enable learners to work unsupervised.

Building Your Qualification

This Apprenticeship is equivalent to five GCSE passes. The Level Two Certificate in Supporting Teaching and Learning in Schools Qualifications & Credit Framework (QCF) is the foundation of the apprenticeship supported by qualifications in functional skills and employee rights and responsibilities.

Level Two Certificate in Supporting Teaching & Learning in Schools (QCF): The foundational qualification of this apprenticeship has 30 Credits and 180 Guided Learning Hours. The mandatory units are listed on the reverse side.

Functional Skills: There are no formal entry requirements in order to become an apprentice, but to successfully complete the framework learners must achieve qualifications in:

- Level 2 English
- Level 1 Math
- Level 1 Information and Communications Technology (ICT)

Employee Rights and Responsibilities: The ERR element of this framework will be met by completion of the Level 2 Unit - Schools as organisations.
